Are you planning to go to college or university in 2022 to study an HNC, HND or degree?



What is Higher Education?

Higher Education, often referred to as HE, is study at SCQF levels 7 and above on the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF). School SQA Highers are at SCQF level 6; HNC is at SCQF level 7; HND is at SCQF level 8; an ordinary degree is at SCQF level 9 and an honours degree is at SCQF level 10.



Our Preparing for Higher Education (Fast-Track) course will give you the confidence to progress with your education and help ease the transition from school or from the workplace to college or university.

By participating in a range of interactive workshop sessions, you will gain a valuable insight into Higher Education before embarking on your course.

Some of the skills you will learn include:

- Critical thinking
- Study skills
- Analytical skills
- Online research
- Time management
- Report writing
- Presentation skills

And even if your plans change, the knowledge and skills you develop will still be very useful for your future career!
